

SUGGESTED ITINERARY URUGUAY 5 NTS / 6 DAYS

DAY 01: MONTEVIDEO.



Arrival to Montevideo International Airport and transfer to your Hotel.

This afternoon you will enjoy a City Tour.

Montevideo gathers all the qualities of a great capital city, from the colonial charm to the modern urban appearance. Besides the friendliness of its people, the city provides a complete accommodation structure and services for all visitors. Essentially a riverside city, it features beautiful beaches and an inviting architectural style. The city also has a fishing neighborhood, and most of the country's international commerce goes through its port.

Itinerary: Old City (The Cathedral, The Cabildo, Solis Theatre, Independence Square, Salvo Palace), the city center (Fabini Square, Entrevero Square, the Congress Palace, 18 de Julio Ave.), el Prado traditional area (Botanica Gardens, the Presidential House, the Monument to the Last Charruas), the Governor house, the Obelisk, Battle Park with the stadium and monument The Wagon. Residential areas of Buceo, Punta Gorda and Carrasco with deluxe gardens, the beaches and Pocitos.

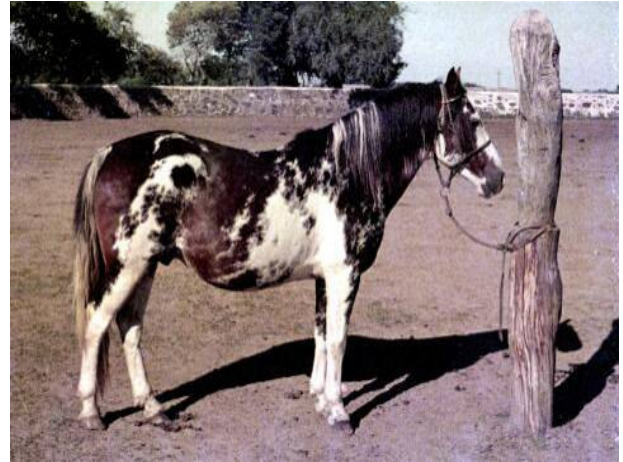

DAY 03: MONTEVIDEO / SAN PEDRO TIMOTE

After Breakfast you will head to Estancia San Pedro Timote

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Estancia San Pedro de Timote was founded in 1854 by Pedro Jose Jackson on the lands of a cattle farm belonging to the Jesuit Fathers. Through the years, it has remained an important cattle ranch of Uruguay. In 1997, it was declared a historical national monument because of its architectural style, the design of its outdoor sites, the natural scenery that surrounds it, and the values that it represents. San Pedro de Timote has been totally refurbished as a country hotel with all the services and amenities needed for a pleasant stay. There is an indoor pool and two outdoor pools, a playroom, two TV rooms, a tennis court and other recreational facilities. The main house has multiple sitting areas, many with fireplaces lit in the evening. Meals are served in a separate building, which houses a restaurant with an open barbecue pit and a smaller bar/lounge, each with a fireplace for those cool evenings.

Rooms are divided between the historic main house and the family's guest house. All rooms are decorated in the country style and have private bathrooms, central air-conditioning, heating and cable TV. The rooms in the main house all open onto verandas and most have fireplaces.

Activities: Library, Heated swimming pool, Spa, Chapel, Restaurant, horse rides, mountain bike, "Photographic Safaris"

DAY 05: SAN PEDRO TIMOTE/COLONIA DEL SACRAMENTO

Alter breakfast your private transfer will take you to Colonia del Sacramento

Due to its peculiar architecture, completely full of history in many of its facades, it has been declared World Historical Heritage by UNESCO in 1995. It was founded by

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Portuguese and, due to its important geopolitical location, Spaniards fought over its possession during decades. It is in this way that the city became into a mixture of architectural styles: the Spanish, with brick houses and flat roofs and the Portuguese, with stone houses and pitched roofs.



It is very easy to fall in love with its colonial streets (made from wedge-shaped cobblestones), with its colors, its sunsets, its history still alive everywhere.

Today enjoy a City Tour of Colonia del Sacramento

To see the historic neighborhood, we will start at Portón de Campo (Door of the Citadel), dated from 1745, a real historical attraction, with its stone walls and its bridge over the moat, and then continue by its old stone streets up its squares, where major interest buildings are situated the Iglesia Matriz (Matriz Church), the oldest of the country, several times reconstructed due to the successive destructions caused by warlike conflicts; the Museum of the Portuguese and the Spanish Museum. Then, we will take the Calle de los Suspiros (Street of the Sighs), a symbol of the historical neighborhood of Colonia: a narrow street with typical constructions of the first half of 18th century, the most ancient houses of the city.

Continue by San Pedro Street up to the secular ruins of the Convent of San Francisco. The lighthouse will illuminate the bay: climb its stairs, have a nice view of the city from above and finally go down and continue walking by its colonial streets, visiting its ancient houses opened to the traveler.

After Breakfast your private transfer will take you to the Port to board the Ferryboat for a one hour trip to Buenos Aires.
